**Wauwatosa Athlete to Compete in 2007
Special Olympics World Summer Games in Shanghai**

Madison- Timothy Maloney, 27 of Wauwatosa, is one of three from Wisconsin joining a 540-member delegation representing the United States as Team USA at the 2007 Special Olympics World Summer Games in Shanghai, China. This event marks the 12th Special Olympics World Games and the second time these games are held in Asia.

Maloney is set to compete in track and field at the Games. He has been involved in Special Olympics for 28 years, and has trained in track for all of them. Maloney has won various awards through Special Olympics including winning a gold medal in track at the 2006 Special Olympics Wisconsin State Summer Games. His hobbies include working on cars and playing various sports, including bowling on a league with his dad. Maloney is excited to attend the 2007 World Games in Shanghai.

“It will be a great experience,” he said. “I get to meet different people and go to a different country.”

Team USA will meet next July in Nashville for training Camp. They will meet their World Games coach there, and continue training for a medal-winning performance in China.

International competition through Special Olympics aims to accomplish a unique goal. As athletes transcend boundaries including geography, culture and religion they join in the common pursuit of achievement and the shared moment of victory, which brings even the most diverse people together.
